

Secluded residence of a key 19th-century modernizer



Tomomi Iwakura was a politician during the Edo and Meiji periods. From 1862 to 1867 he lived a secluded life at this residence. The grounds also house a library containing Iwakura's manuscripts and materials which focus on his works for modernisation.



Originally built in 1415, this temple has been destroyed then rebuilt 7 times. times from attacks from other Buddhist sects. The most famous involved the demise of Nobunaga Oda. However, throughout every disaster the treasures within were preserved and can now be viewed.







column 1 Feel the Gravitas of Ancient Kyoto at Your Feet

Kyoto ASNY is built on the Heian Jingu site of the Miki-no-Tsukasa, or imperial brewery, the office for producing sake and vinegar for the imperial court. And, at the front of ASNY, visitors can see a floor layout showing the pillar positions of the ancient brewery warehouse.

Model of Rajomon Gate recreated at the North Exit plaza in front of JR Kyoto Station

A one-tenth scale model of the Heian-kyo symbol "Rajomon Gate" was unveiled in November 2016 at this new spot where it can be lined up with Kyoto Tower for incredible ancient-modern shots, making the gate a must-visit camera spot.

This gate used to stand in Minami Ward in an area that is now a park and has a stone marker showing were the gate stood.


